Oar's Family Support Group offers a safe environment for the family and friends of those incarcerated to meet with one another and a trained facilitator to share their experiences and the challenges related to incarceration and the criminal justice system.

## 2. All God's Children Camp (Ages 7-12)

All God's Children Camp is a weeklong overnight camp for children ages 7 to 12, with an incarcerated parent. One-to-one mentoring program where campers have an adult who walks alongside them for the week cheering them on, building them up, and encouraging them daily.
