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## 1. Chicago Children's Museum

Beyond Incarceration is a new program in its pilot phase, that supports children with incarcerated parents through 3 programs: Field trips for extended families and support networks who often reside in communities disproportionately affected by incarceration; arts-focused programs for children and caregivers; and museum-based visitation for children and their incarcerated parents. *The Chicago Children's Museum also offers 3 free family days/year, and discounted admission for EBT/WIC enrollees.*

One For One is a non-profit organization supporting young adults living in Chicago neighborhoods with high rates of violent crime and joblessness. They also offer to teens their Keeping Grounded Garden Program, which provides paid summer internships to One For One teens at urban farm locations on the west side of Chicago.
